Fred Talk: Humility

Of everything I learned while I was in formation to become a religious sister, becoming humble was the most challenging, and still is. This means learning to die to self, becoming self-less. Once we abandon ourselves, to be renewed in the Holy Spirit of God, our lives change for the better, in many ways.

This kind of change does not happen overnight. It takes time to become the person God is waiting for. He is very patient with us. Have you noticed?

Our St. Vincent de Paul-National Formation Director, Tim Williams, shares with us in his Fred Talk, the essence of Vincentian humility, which is found in the *Rule*, Part 1, section 2.5.1.

A few comments made by Tim in his short video, [Our Vincentian Virtues - Humility on Vimeo](#) :

- In giving, we receive.
- It is not about us; it is about them.
- The poor become our Lord and master once we do what God asks of us.
- Don't brag about what we can do. All that we do is from God, and for God.
- He referenced St. Louise de Marillac's comments concerning vanity.

Also, the *Litany of Humility*¹ is a beautiful traditional Catholic prayer that captures the essence of humility.

O Jesus! meek and humble of heart, Hear me.

From the desire of being esteemed,
Deliver me, Jesus.

From the desire of being loved...

From the desire of being extolled ...

From the desire of being honored ...

From the desire of being praised ...

From the desire of being preferred to others...

From the desire of being consulted ...

From the desire of being approved ...

From the fear of being humiliated ...

From the fear of being despised...

From the fear of suffering rebukes ...

From the fear of being calumniated ...

From the fear of being forgotten ...

From the fear of being ridiculed ...

From the fear of being wronged ...

From the fear of being suspected ...

That others may be loved more than I,
Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it.

That others may be esteemed more than I ...

That, in the opinion of the world, others may increase and I
may decrease ...

That others may be chosen and I set aside ...

That others may be praised and I unnoticed ...

That others may be preferred to me in everything...

That others may become holier than I, provided that I may
become as holy as I should.

Ponder these words in the silence, without distractions, to contemplate what they mean, then listen for guidance from the Holy Spirit. He may very well provide you with the courage to improve in particular areas, as well as the wisdom on how to make changes. Ask for these things in prayer with God, then be patient.

The deadline for submitting nominations to lisarobinson@onboardnow.org is January 15, 2023.

After receiving nominations, our committee will prepare a slate of nominees to share with the nine district presidents. As a gentle reminder, only the nine District Presidents will vote. The nine district presidents will have three months to consult with their respective conferences during which time the conferences will have an opportunity to meet the candidates. The deadline to submit their vote is May 1, 2023.

Only Full (Active) members may be Officers at any level of the Society. Full (Active) status is given to members who are Catholic, attend Conference/Council meetings regularly, are actively involved in the life of the Conference/Council (decision making and works), are not members of ordained clergy, and receive no salary or remuneration (except for approved reimbursable expenses) from the Society at any level.

To become a candidate, in accepting the nomination, the nominee must submit in writing an autobiographical summary, a platform statement, and a photograph. The autobiography, platform, and picture will be reproduced for distribution. No modification, correction, or re-typing will be performed on any document.

SVdP Georgia Community Pharmacy Application Process

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE PHARMACY APPLICATION PROCESS:

COMPLETING AN APPLICATION

There are TWO parts to the Pharmacy application:

- 1) CMS referral (click [here](#) for instructions)
- 2) [Online referral form](#)

In order to speed up the application process, **please be sure to complete BOTH referrals at the same time and provide complete and accurate contact information (phone & email) for your referral.** Missing information will result in a processing delay. All patients are contacted by the Pharmacy within 1 to 2 weeks of receiving a complete application.



SENDING PRESCRIPTION(s) TO OUR PHARMACY

The next step is for the Pharmacy to obtain a copy of the patient's prescription(s). Getting a prescription transferred from another pharmacy is very time consuming and increases the error rate as these have to be done manually over the phone. Many patients will have a dozen or more prescriptions on file with multiple pharmacies, even though many of those may have been discontinued by their physician. To minimize the errors, as well as the number of unnecessary prescriptions, and the pharmacists' time to process these transfers, our Pharmacy now requires patients to have their prescribing physician send a new prescription directly to our Pharmacy. Each patient is given written instructions on how to complete this process.

AVOIDING DELAYS

Much of the delay is due to the time it takes to receive the prescription from the physician (delays at the office or delays from the patient making the request). As a Caseworker, you can help speed up this part of the process by reminding patients to request the prescription from their physician, and coaching them through following up with their physician's office staff.

Dr. Sam Ricks, currently our only pharmacist on staff, processes over 1,000 prescriptions each month, provides individual counseling to patients, and spends hours trying to obtain prescriptions from physicians. In order to help deliver the most efficient and high quality pharmacy service to our neighbors in need, we ask that you ensure all applications are complete and accurate, and guide patients to submit prescriptions directly to our Pharmacy.

Conference Helps a Political Refugee Family

The **Immaculate Heart of Mary (IHM) Conference** recently helped a family of political refugees from a conflicted South American country who escaped to Atlanta. The couple, in their 30s, along with their 12-year old son, only spoke Spanish when they arrived and struggled with seeking shelter and food as well navigating areas such as getting proper documents for school, and searching for jobs.

When a Spanish-speaking Vincentian at IHM first met them, they were living in a rented room. They needed food, clothing, permanent shelter, and jobs. After a couple of days, they figured out how to use MARTA. They both found jobs themselves by asking every business around where they were living. IHM initially helped them with a partial deposit on an apartment, quickly followed by food and clothing vouchers. Vincentians then helped them secure basic furniture for their empty apartment by working with the St. Vincent de Paul Georgia Thrift Store that provided a free sofa, bed, frame and sheets for the son. They secured a new queen bed and frame as well. Shortly after, the family was able to enroll their son in school and arrange for all immunizations and documents.

Thanks to the generosity of the IHM parish, the IHM Conference at SVdP Georgia was able to provide this family with immediate help and basic living needs to give them a new beginning in America!

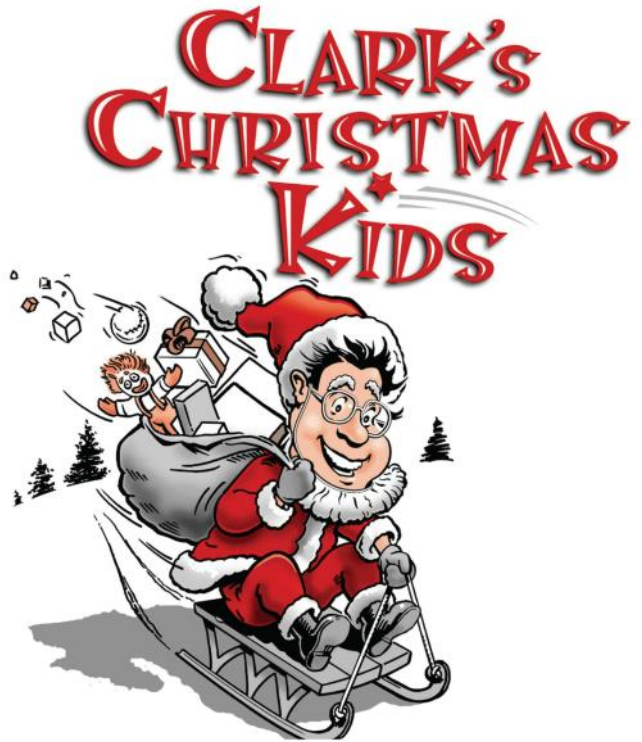
