Motel to Home

What is it?


- A year of one-to-one Case Management with a SVdP caseworker to help them navigate the rental selection and leasing process and help participants forming strong relationships with non-profit community and faith-based organizations to create a safety net of long-term support.
- Financial support for deposits, first month's rent, targeted debt reduction, moving-costs and the
 opportunity to obtain matching funds for savings accounts and job training to achieve a living
 wage.
- Education from on-going workshops to enhance participants' skills to manage their personal finances, housing, career advancement, and personal development.

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Motel to Home

Who is it for?

- Participants are living in an extended stay motel, a vehicle, "couch surfing", transitional housing, a shelter.
- They have verifiable income to maintain affordable housing.
- They are able to self-direct the rental selection and leasing process with support from their SVdP GA caseworker.
- They are willing and open to learning new skills and committed to stabilizing their housing situation.
- · They are willing to participate in the administrative aspects of the program (our data survey, etc.)



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Success of the M2H program!

St. Vincent de Paul Georgia provides stability and creates paths to self-sufficiency.

Over 90 families in 3 metro counties: 435+ people including children

To date, 99% remain housed

Average hourly salary rate increased approx. 20%

Average credit score increased from 510-615

Successful saving and money management

SVdP skills building workshops

Child wellbeing: school attendance and academic improvement

Motel to Home

Current Program funding is approx. \$3,000/household:

- We expect to have limited grant funding in 2023 from the United Way of Greater Atlanta for Butts, Cherokee, Coweta, Cobb, Clayton, Dekalb, Douglas, Fayette, Fulton, Gwinnett, Henry, Paulding and Rockdale counties. We anticipate funding for 3 households/month.
- We plan to reach out to the United Way organizations in Athens, Dalton, Rome, Griffin, Macon, Cumming, and Forsyth to fund M2H in your conference. We are seeking United Way contacts in your region. If you can help with insight or connections, please be in contact.
- We are making philanthropic funding asks to support bringing M2H to your conferences, statewide.
- Your conference can self-fund its own Motel to Home program if you have funds to do so. Or, if
 not enough conference funds, you can seek to twin with a neighboring conference to bring Motel
 to Home to your conferences.

Motel to Home

How to Join the M2H program:

- Volunteer! Ideally, your conference will have a minimum of (2) two caseworkers. This casework is a long-term commitment.
- You can volunteer to help with the workshops participants attend, generally quarterly on Saturdays (teaching budgeting, teaching tenant skills, etc.)
- You can help with resources for families, such as providing the "welcome home" bucket
- How to start as a M2H volunteer? In 2023, we will host a Trauma Informed Care training and a M2H orientation training.

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Motel to Home – the Landlord Engagement Piece

Landlord Engagement- What is it?

A landlord engagement program provides incentives and assurances to landlords to motivate them to rent to tenants with histories of homelessness and backgrounds that typically make it challenging to find someone to rent to them (e.g., criminal background, eviction history).



Motel to Home – the Landlord Engagement Piece

Landlord Engagement - What is the relevance to M2H?

We want to help neighbors in need in our M2H program locate safe, affordable housing.

We can find landlords who are mission aligned with us. They understand and support our mission to help neighbors become self-sufficient and feel confident to partner with us because of our involvement.

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Goals for SVdP GA's Landlord Engagement Program

- We want to identify landlords and property owners willing to rent safe, affordable housing to M2H and other SVdP GA families.
- We want to have strong landlord retention.
- Foster healthy communication between landlords, SVdP GA, and our program participants.
- Ensure M2H families are educated about tenant and landlord responsibilities and are "Ready to Rent."
- Maintain a Council fund for landlord's risk mitigation (for rent or damages) that is rarely, if ever, touched.

Risk mitigation fund	 Maintain a housing inventory in your community and help match interested landlords with M2H participants 	
Provision of tenant education curriculum for tenant education to be "Ready to Rent"	Be involved, when needed, to respond and remedy concerns of landlords and help tenants meet obligations	
Assist with virtual inspections of rented homes (when helpful).	Deliver the "Ready to Rent" curriculum to M2H households and assist with workshops


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Caseworker Training


