A NOTE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Dear fellow Vincentians,

The best part of my job is being able to tell others about the great work St. Vincent de Paul does – and primarily the great work that our Vincentian members do in Conferences, thrift stores and food pantries every day. When I am meeting with someone who does not know much about St. Vincent de Paul – whether donors, community partners, or potential corporate partners – I love to highlight what makes us unique among charitable organizations.

The first is that we are a Catholic lay membership organization and the vast majority of the work done by the Society is done by Vincentian members and other volunteers. You may not appreciate how significant that is, but let me put it in context. Last year, you and other volunteers contributed 1,393,647 hours of service. Yes, 1.4 million hours! And I suspect that is probably understated because we are not always great about recording our volunteer hours. Do you know that, using the IRS rate for volunteer hours, your volunteer hours were valued at over \$41,000,000 last year? Incredible.

The second key differentiator between the Society and other charities is the way we deliver our services. We treat people as neighbors being helped by neighbors, not as clients being helped by a charity agency. This is best exemplified in the Home Visit, where we sit and visit with neighbors in need, understanding their needs, sharing their burdens.



This is truly unique to St. Vincent de Paul. And it allows us to provide our neighbors with the <u>Hope</u> that comes from knowing someone else cares. It is the power of this Hope that we will be celebrating at Morning of Hope in two weeks. I look forward to seeing many of you there!

The third characteristic that differentiates us is our spiritual dimension. We recognize that we are all on a faith journey, and our ultimate goal as Vincentians is to grow together in holiness through service to Christ in the person of our suffering neighbor. No one better exemplifies this than Sister Mary Francis, our outgoing Council Spiritual Advisor, who has dedicated her life to serving others.When I asked Sister to be our Spiritual Advisor three years ago, she (somewhat reluctantly) agreed. And how fortunate we are that she did! She has been a tremendous leader and a constant advocate for our spiritual growth. Sister is relocating for the next three years to Tijuana, Mexico to minister to the poor and imprisoned. See her farewell message on page 3. Sister goes with our immense gratitude. Please join me in praying for her and her ministry.

My dear fellow Vincentians,

May 16th will be my last day in Georgia for the next three years, in order to serve the least of our brothers and sisters in Tijuana, Mexico, where our mission houses are located. I have been receiving "divine nudges" for the past two years that I need to help serve those in prison and the poor, specifically in Tijuana. Our number of active sisters is very low, due to

Covid. I am accepting this higher calling from God to serve in a third world country, saying yes to His Will for me.

As habited religious sisters, God uses us for His Will. We are his hands and feet. Daily unplanned, unexpected meetings with strangers take place everywhere, due to the wearing of the habit and veil. Because of this, we have the opportunity to evangelize, console, and pray with them. Often, I end the exchange with, "I'll see you in Heaven!"

The life of a Vincentian is much the same way, letting God use us as his vessels to reach others, imitating his unconditional love.

Both St. Vincent de Paul and St. John Eudes (our sisters' patron saint) served the least of our brothers and sisters, prayed with clients, evangelized, and brought souls to Christ. Both were priests who actively lived their faith as shepherds of their local flocks.

Recently our sisters met for an annual retreat. We learned that St. John Eudes and St. Vincent de Paul were inspired by the same spiritual director, Cardinal Pierre de Berelle. It's no wonder we can clearly see what they had in common, that both saints had the same charitable heart of compassion for those who suffer.

Both remarkable leaders continually worked to become more holy through their service to the materially and spiritually poor. All faithful Vincentians, whether priests, deacons, brothers, sisters, or lay Catholics, strive to deepen Vincentian spirituality through service to the suffering Christ, with every opportunity presented to us by God himself.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve you as the SVdP Georgia-Council Spiritual Advisor for the past 2 and ½ years.
