THERE'S A PLACE FOR YOU

There are many ways to get involved with St. Vincent de Paul, whether you have just a couple hours or several per week. Our volunteers, known as Vincentians, come from various backgrounds and skillsets—doctors, lawyers, students, parents, retirees, laborers, and office workers. They share a common goal: to serve their community and follow the teachings of Christ.

Below are just some of the ways to get involved with a St. Vincent de Paul Conference. Scan the QR code below for more information about volunteer opportunities in your area.

Caseworker – serves as the point person for facilitating help to a neighbor.

Home Visitor – works with a Vincentian partner to meet neighbors in their home – offering help, hope, prayer and resources to lift them up.

Intake Worker – first point of contact for a neighbor in need of a helping hand and friendly voice.

Food Pantry – coordinates food collection and distribution.

Seasonal Program Volunteer – helps with organizing seasonal programs to help provide either meals or gifts typically during the holiday seasons.

Voice of the Poor Liaison – helps advocate for marginalized members of our society through meaningful social action and community education.

Treasury Support – assists in the collection, counting and recording of parishioner donations.

Second/Assistant Home Visitor – a partner Vincentian who attends a home visit and/or assists with the case

Outreach/Recruitment Volunteer – helps organize volunteer recruitment activities and efforts.

Spiritual Advisor – leads reflection and prayer at conference meetings based on the teachings and mission of the Society of SVdP.

Communications / Parish Liaison – works with parish communications office to inform the community of SVdP activities.

CMS / Data Administrator – helps enter and track case information in the SVdP database.

Fundraiser – assists in raising awareness for the organization and the impact that donations can have on assisting our neighbors in need.

Hunger Program Coordinator – helps lead the food pantry and food-related efforts to help alleviate hunger in the community.

Housing Program Coordinator – helps build local partnerships and coordinate efforts to help find resources for neighbors in need of stable and affordable housing.

Health Program Coordinator – helps coordinate efforts with the St. Vincent de Paul free pharmacy and other local healthcare providers.
