

Neighbors with Housing Authority Vouchers

If you are working with a Neighbor who has a Housing Voucher from a Housing Authority, and she is looking for a Landlord, you can refer her to the LEAP Program:

LEAP Referral Form

Please set expectations. **LEAP Navigator Shonda Tillman** will seek to assist, but finding a landlord and obtaining a lease is not guaranteed.



Motel to Home Program

If you are working with a Neighbor who:

- Has enough verifiable income to meet rent and other household expenses? (not over 35% of monthly income to rent)
- Has been in a hotel for 30 days or more? These days do not need to be consecutive days, but must be in the past 3 months.
- Has IDs, social security cards, children's birth certificates and at least 4 weeks of verifiable income, as well as the hotel receipts.

Refer to the Motel to Home Program



MARI: Move-In Assistance Program

If you are working with a Neighbor in Butts, Cherokee, Coweta, Cobb, Clayton, Dekalb, Douglas, Fayette, Fulton, Gwinnett, Henry, Paulding, Rockdale and they need move-in funds:

- Do they have enough verifiable income or SSI, SSDI to meet rent and other household expenses?
- Are they approved for housing?


