# MARILLAC MOMS

Supporting women with compassion and community,  
inspired by St. Louise de Marillac.



Saint Vincent de Paul Georgia has launched a transitional housing program for pregnant women inspired by St. Louise de Marillac, a 17th century champion for women and children, and peer of our patron saint, Vincent de Paul.

We serve single, pregnant, homeless moms with children currently in their care. We provide one year of residency in a St. Vincent de Paul master-leased apartment. Dedicated volunteers facilitate life skills and parenting classes, job assistance, weekly mentoring, budgeting assistance and more, with a goal of building self-sufficiency and a stable home environment for the mother and her children.



Stable housing has been shown to directly correlate to healthy pregnancy and delivery, our most important objective. Through a holistic approach to skill-building and preparing women for independence, we expect to see our moms fully self-sufficient within 15 months, with continued stability at least one year after graduating from the program.

The Marillac Moms program relies on individual donors and volunteers to help us scale the program. Financial Sponsorships and committed volunteers willing to work directly with our 'moms' for a full year will help us achieve our goal of opening at least one apartment in each SVdP district throughout the state.
